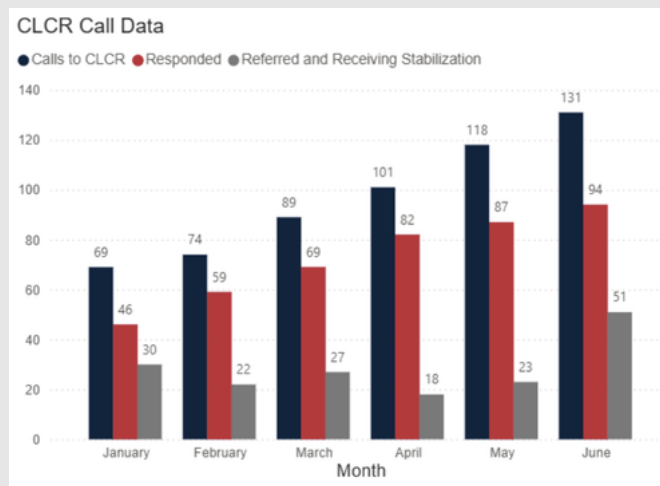

AUDIT UPDATE:

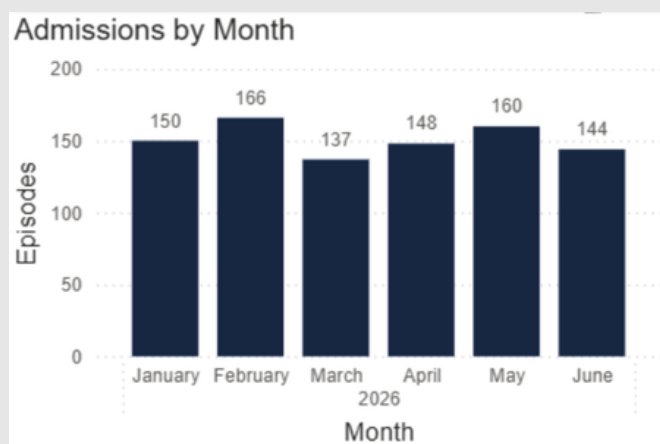

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

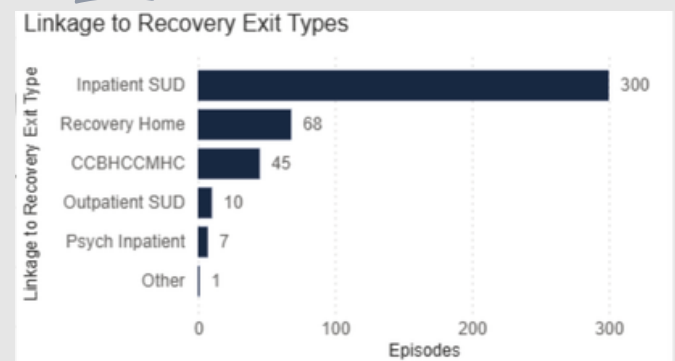
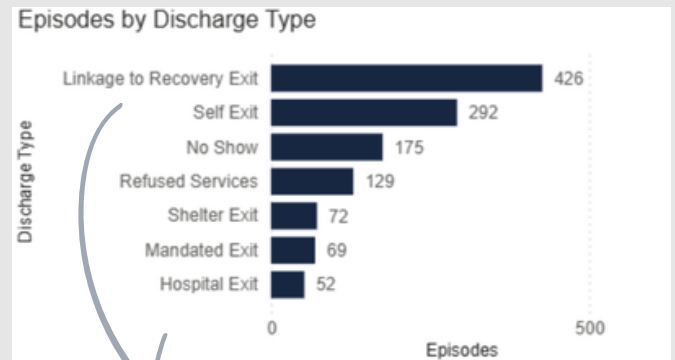
The **Clinician-Led Community Response** team utilizes licensed behavioral health professionals who provide crisis assistance and connect individuals to resources across Marion County.



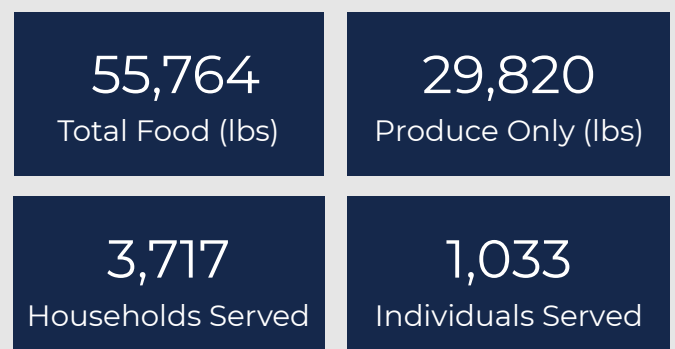
The **Assessment & Intervention Center** provides free, 24/7 assistance to those navigating mental health, addiction recovery, homelessness, and other challenges.



This top graph shows where people go upon leaving the AIC. If they are linked to recovery services (the top item), the bottom graph breaks that down further into exactly what type of facility they go to.



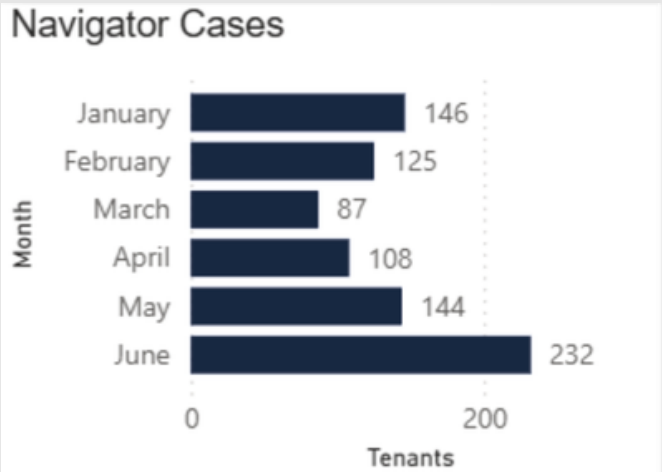
COMMUNITY NUTRITION AND FOOD POLICY

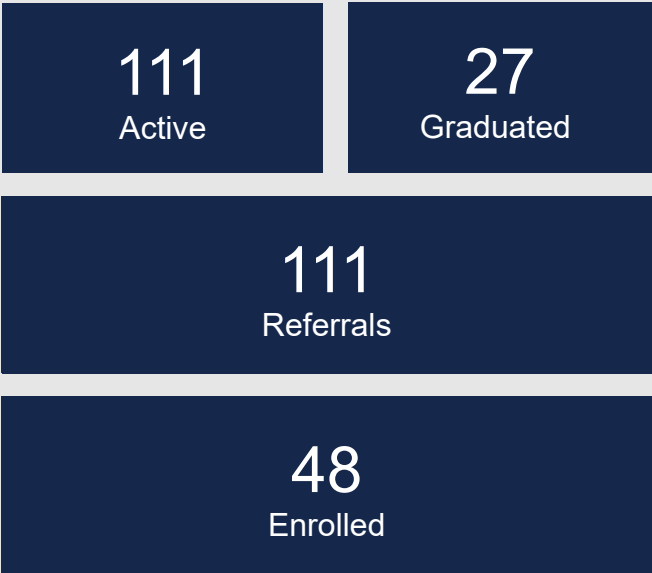

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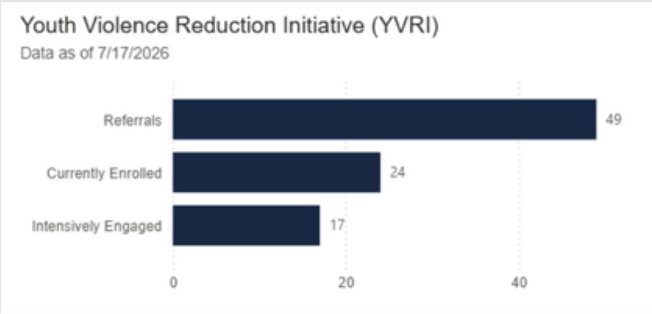
COMMUNITY VIOLENCE REDUCTION

Our Indy Peace team – which includes outreach workers, life coaches, and violence interrupters – works to address and prevent violent crime.

The **Indy Peace Fellowship** is a 12 - 18 month program aimed at empowering participants – survivors of gun violence – to break the cycle and create positive change.



The **Youth Violence Reduction Initiative**, launched in August 2025, takes lessons learned from the Mayor’s Gun Violence Reduction Strategy and applies it to our youth.

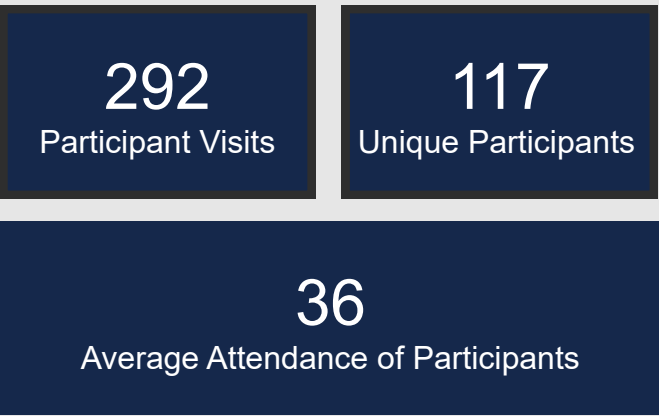


Note: Data represents referrals since the program launched.

Intensive engagement is defined as at least 2x per week or more in-person contact.

Our annual **Summer in the City** programming kicked off in June, with major changes to structure in 2026 due to direct feedback from youth and youth-serving organizations over the past year. OPHS and Indy Peace learned that youth were looking for safe places to go on weekend evenings.

This year’s programming runs Friday and Saturday evenings, from 6 to 10 p.m. all summer long, and is hosted by Let Them Talk, Inc.



PROGRAMMING UPDATES

OPHS had several key events in July, starting with a focus on the July 4 holiday weekend. This year, the Indy Peace team focused on offering safe, family-friendly programming on the holiday itself, while also dedicating resources to overnight hours and downtown outreach. Indy Peace also hosted a Cars and Community kickball tournament throughout the month, an effort aimed at outreach and education with a high-risk community.
